





BMGF Joined forces with existing momentum






RESULTS:


- 1. 93 % Reduction in animal cases.
- 2. One human case in final two years.
- 3. Expansion 420000 doses of vaccine distributed into 5 neighboring provinces and countries.

CHALLENGES / Services BEAUROCRACY

What is the "DIFFICULT?" part of rabies control.

Constant political changes (7 HOD's; 6 Ministers)
Other more important diseases (FMD; CSF)
Staff fatigue (160 AHT's vaccinated 3,5 million dogs)
Individuals (Final pockets of the disease!)






Vaccine bank stimulates expansion
